COOL MOTORCYCLE STORAGE

ur daughter, Lindsay, bought a house that didn't have a garage for her motorcycle. One day, she called to say it was time to build a shed. Easy enough until her specifications come into play – no bigger than it has to be, about the height of a 4-foot fence and she has to be able to ride into and out of it.

The result is a 4-foot wide, 7-foot long structure about 4-1/2-foot high. Open the front doors and it unlocks the front of the roof. Pull one rod and the back is unlocked. With the assistance of gas struts, the roof opens easily and stays that way until closed. When putting the bike

away, the right side of the roof is closed followed by the left side, which overlaps the top of the right side keeping water out. One key works the lockset and deadbolt, making it fairly secure. It was a fun father/daughter project!
